The Undergraduate Organizations Funding Committee (UOFC) is a student run body that oversees the distribution of more than \$130,000 to undergraduate organizations under the auspices of Yale College Dean's Office. Meeting once every two weeks, committee members discuss funding decisions for the organizations. Each member will be a liaison for a certain group of organizations and is responsible for funding recommendations concerning those organizations.

Ten committee positions are open for the 2007-2008 academic year. All undergraduates are welcome to apply – no experience is expected. **Applications must be submitted to the Dean's Office at SSS 110 by noon on Wednesday, September 19th.** Ten-minute interviews will be conducted with short listed candidates by Edgar Letriz, Assistant Dean of Student Affairs and Joshua Tan, Chair of the UOFC. Interviews will occur throughout the afternoon of that Friday, September 21st; please make sure that you are available at that time.

- 1) Why do you wish to serve on the Undergraduate Organizations Funding Committee?
- 2) Please list all the campus activities (or high school activities for freshman) in which you have been involved, including any University Committees on which you have served. Indicate which activities are current (*). In which have you held leadership positions?
- 3) What are your time commitments for the year?
- 4) What types of funding experiences have you had? (Note: Previous funding experience is certainly not required, but can be helpful).

- 5) Please list an instance in which you worked on a team to arrive at a consensus.
Would you be comfortable making funding decisions through group discussions?

- 6) The UOFC has undergone much reform in the past year. Given what you know about the committee, what do you see as its vision? What other services (if any) do you believe the UOFC should provide for undergraduate organizations?
